The ransom can bring us many benefits.


(See chapter 5 of the *Bible Teach* book, paragraphs 14-17.)

Read Colossians 1:13, 14 and Hebrews 9:13, 14.

How can the ransom free us from excessive guilt over our sins?

Read Romans 6:23.

In what sense will faithful humans benefit from the ransom throughout eternity?



Like a gift that benefits you only if you use it, the ransom can bring us many blessings —but only if we show we have faith in it

We should show our appreciation for the ransom.

(See chapter 5 of the *Bible Teach* book, paragraphs 18-22.)

Read John 17:3 and 1 John 5:3.

If we appreciate the ransom, what will we be moved to do?

Read John 3:16 and James 2:26.

Is it enough simply to say that we believe in Jesus' ransom sacrifice?

In what ways do you especially want to show your appreciation for the ransom?

3 EXPLAIN YOUR BELIEFS

IF SOMEONE SAYS...

YOU MIGHT REPLY...

IF SOMEONE SAYS...

All that is needed for salvation is belief in Jesus.

YOU MIGHT REPLY...

I agree that belief in Jesus is essential. But I am also convinced that more than belief is needed because...

What scripture could you share with the person?
